# **President's Message**



Here we are in the height of summer in Florida and looking forward to another several months of hot weather, nervously watching what's coming off of Africa and developing in the Caribbean till hurricane season is over. But we remain calm and carry on as they say. It's good training for politics or parenthood, I'm told.

Many good things are happening here at UUCFL. The new Board has had its retreat, and we are developing an outline for a new long-range plan. Susan has agreed to be our minister for the next five years. The improvements and repairs to our building are continuing, thanks in large part to the Wednesday Daytimers group for many tasks and the Building and Grounds Committee's hard work. We will be having a congregational meeting on September 23rd to vote on bylaw updates and a new name. So what's in a name?

Well, many things. I like my name because there aren't many Martys; but with an organization, its name starts to tell the story of that organization and who its people are before any other information is conveyed. So it is with the Unitarian Universalist Church of Ft. Lauderdale, in particular the "Church" part. I was raised Catholic and since about the age of 16 jokingly referred to myself as an escapee of the Catholics, so when I was getting divorced and a therapist said, "You should go check out the Unitarian church," I was less than impressed. But I finally did, and 36 years later I am still here. I have heard similar stories from many people of non-Christian backgrounds (Jewish, Hindu, etc.), thinking we are Christian-based, and people who have rejected Christianity thinking we're going to draw them back in. Atheists, agnostics, pagans, New Age people, and spiritual seekers will almost always put "church" in the category of what they've rejected or run away from. Also, I think many millennials regard church as an irrelevant and outmoded concept.

We want to do somewhat of a makeover and change our name but still be UU and Ft. Lauderdale, so we're thinking of changing the church part to Congregation or Center or some other such word. If we keep it a "C" word we don't have to change the web site or a lot of other things. Or stumble over a new acronym. The pagans do seem to have "Circle" locked up but we can probably talk. ;o) If you have any other ideas along these lines, please do send them to me at mpminfla@gmail.com. Or if you hate the idea, tell me why and what you would rather do. Listening Sessions on bylaws and possible name change will take place in September.

#### Bylaws, or "How I Got My Geek On At Church"

Lastly, for the uninitiated, Bylaws are really a thing. There are two main legal documents that we as a congregation live by: The Charter, (which is filed with the state when we incorporate and lets the state know who we are and how we define ourselves as a corporation,) and the bylaws, (which are created by a committee and the board and then presented to the congregation and voted on.) By approving the bylaws the congregation decides how it wishes to govern itself. Any changes to the bylaws must be approved by the congregation at a meeting called for that purpose or at the annual meeting. As time goes on and many small changes are made to fix or update things or circumstances change but the bylaws aren't updated, sometimes a congregation will end up where we are. There's nothing particularly wrong with the bylaws but some areas contradict each other, some places overlap, some committees are too big, some committees don't work for the church anymore, and other areas don't match what we do now. So, in late June I asked the board to approve a committee to review and update the bylaws in their entirety. Also, last year we approved bringing the Endowment corporation under the church corporation as a committee of the congregation. The endowment board has done their work on how to make that happen so the endowment bylaws must be incorporated into the church bylaws as a whole new section, I'm assuming. The bylaws committee and endowment board are still working out the details. Lhurch

# Rev. Susan's Space

We have work to do. You have to be a certain kind of person to really enjoy bylaw revisions and strategic plan vetting, but let's do it anyway. In September, we will be having listening sessions and then a congregational meeting to vote on bylaw revisions. These include fairly simple things, from reducing the size of the Nominating Committee from 6 (yes, 6!!!) members to a more doable number to considering changing our name to UU Congregation of Fort Lauderdale. We will consider whether to declare ourselves a weapon-free zone and if we are satisfied with how we define membership. After our Board approves the changes at its August meeting, we'll post those on our website.



In October, we'll have listening sessions about the proposed strategic plan "Values in Action." After your Board of Trustees tweaks the plan at its August meeting, we'll post it on our website, too. The plan calls for a busy 5 years in which we answer the question of whether this congregation will thrive and grow or decline in size and staff. Let me assure you that this will not be one of those plans that gets stuck in a circular file right after the vote, so your vote to affirm this plan will be a commitment to stretch and to strive.

In the meantime, we don't need bylaw revisions or a strategic plan to step up our game as a welcoming and warm congregation.

In my July column, I made the nearly-heretical suggestion that we stop sitting down during social hour. Let me suggest what we should be doing:

- If you are able, park near the street and walk in so visitors can find a spot nearer.
- In the parking lot, speak to anyone you see whether you know them or not. "Good morning!" will do.
- Arrive early, enjoy the groovy music, and chat up someone you don't know.
   Visitors tend to arrive earlier and are trying to see whether this is the place for them.
- Refrain from both shushing others and making noise during the silences.
   Be glad when you hear the sound of children in our midst.
- Immediately after services, help others find refreshments. Most days our members flock to the line, leaving newcomers in the dust and relegating them to the end of the line. Take that first 10 minutes after services to connect with people.

  Move newcomers and families to the head of the line.
- If you usually go out to lunch after services, consider letting others know that they can meet you there. It's one of the MOST effective entryways for newcomers. I'll be glad to make your announcement.
- Or think about staying for Eclectic Mind Shoppe to go deeper in our shared faith.
   In August, I'm starting a 1st Sunday class (Owning Your Religious Past).
   2nd Sundays is Spiritual Philosophy.
   3rd Sundays is Plarning. (Making sleeping mats for the homeless)
   4th Sundays is Casual Contemplation (formerly, Vespers).



#### Path to Membership Adult Education in September





#### **Music as Healing**

In the July Journeys Newsletter, I was reminded how important school safety is to our community. As many of you know, part of my work is as a music teacher for children here in Broward County. So, the issue of student safety in schools is close to

my heart. If you attended the July 22nd Sunday service, you heard the first of a 3 part piano suite that I have composed and performed. What you may not know is that my intent is to record and make available all 3 parts of the music that I composed, as a resource for people in need of emotional healing due to school violence. The three parts of the piece will be recorded and then distributed to those who are in need of the healing power of this music in schools beginning in Broward, but hopefully stretching out to other districts as well.



I have a sister who has just begun doing work in the counseling field for students and their families in the Stoneman Douglas school zone, in answer to the needs of improved emotional health that is so prevalent in that community. Tragedies such as this one do not just go away, and they are felt for many years afterwards. My plan is to get the music to the people that she comes into contact with in her work as a resource to help them in their emotional health pursuits. As I move forward with the recording process of the music, if you would like a copy of my piano suite, please let me know.




