

President's Message

Rev. Susan's Space

The Board and I are excited about two new gatherings we're hosting in the new year – one for social justice/action and the other for our diverse small groups. During my tenure here, we have had no leader for our social justice work. This doesn't mean that we don't do a lot of good works and have some impact in our community. We participate in Broward County's interfaith community organizing program BOLD Justice and send food to LifeNet4Families. We provided toys for 25 children through ChildNet. We've had petition drives and voter registrations. We host numerous organizations working on issues of race, immigration, climate change, and other causes.



Unfortunately, this work is usually done by a very few of us. Even though we clearly stated in our visioning work that we want to have an impact in certain areas, we lack a vehicle to make this happen. The Committee on Ministry has proposed that we develop four Social Action Teams based on the concerns that you all expressed during the visioning, as follows:

- Green Team (Environmental Impact, Climate Change, UUA Green Sanctuary Self-Study)
- Welcoming Congregation (LGBTQ Ministries, Pride, Public presence)
- BOLD Justice (Community Organizing, Congregational Education on Initiatives)
- East Coast Academy Partnership (Tutoring; Weekend Backpack Snacks; School Supply Drive; Mentoring)

I strongly believe that every member of the congregation should find their place in these teams. We'll have our first monthly All Teams Meeting on Wednesday, Jan. 24 (4th Wednesday) at 6:30 pm. If you need a ride, please let me know. If this is a squeeze after work, by all means bring your brown bag. Teens are very welcome to participate in these teams as part of their faith development as UUs.


The second gathering is for ALL small groups within the congregation. This would be spirituality groups like CUUPS and Loaves and Fishes, affinity groups like UU Sisterhood and Men's Group, service groups like Broward Interfaith Planners, and any other "program" of the church in which individuals can participate. Not committees, groups. The ability of our congregation to serve more people depends almost entirely on the health and vitality of our small groups. The Board and the Committee on Ministry want to establish some standardized practices around information sharing, group culture, and mutual support. This (possibly yearly) meeting will be scheduled for February. We will also be holding a similar meeting for all groups that rent from the church to better connect with them and to get information out about what these groups are.

Deeds, not creeds! By their groups ye shall know them! Let's live more fully into the truth of these UU maxims in the coming year.


