Some of us were challenged more than others. During the aftermath, we were there for each other with emotional and physical support. The recent times have been trying and traumatic for all of us here in South Florida throughout the middle of Hurricane Season 2017. Recovery is an important phase of the traumatic experience. We are wise when we take time to process, talk and console others. This is especially important when we have a social conscience and a community we care deeply about. I was impressed with the contact that we kept with each other and the caring that was shown throughout the Hurricane

and then afterward as a caring community, which enabled us to maintain taking care of each other when and where it was needed. This is such an important part of the fabric of a community such as ours.

We are moving forward with our All-Committee/Board Meeting in October (re-scheduled from September due to Hurricane Irma). This is another way we can contribute and show how much we care about our internal community and church's functional structure. During this initial meeting, the Board and the Committees will be interacting and working on developing a deeper and more effective relationship in which we can be more communicative and assist each other better in increasing the quality of the way we work together. This is part of our ongoing effort to become a healthier, more effective community with more meaningful relationships and better service to each other and then to others.

These are processes and goals we identified in the development of our long-range plan, a real cogent growing process in which our entire community benefits. Please find out how you can continue to assist your community inside our church and outside. In times of trauma we all need to feel that other people are there and care for us. Go forth and continue to be awesome...Blessed be.

Even if you did not suffer greatly during the hurricanes, please do not underestimate the strain of an extended period of sympathizing with the plight of others. It is easy to become overwhelmed.




The monsters have gone, but it's still a good idea to hold someone's hand.

Well, it's been a bit of a wild ride, but it is time for all of us to put on our thinking caps and figure out how to fix up our homes and yards, our neighborhoods, our communities, our church, and our whole world. I know many of our members have problems with their abodes and yards, and I am feeling blessed that we only lost a fence and some landscaping, and were only without power for a few days. We have to think of our neighbors in the other parts of Florida who have flooded and muck-filled homes, our neighbors in the Caribbean who have almost nothing left and our friends and neighbors in the Florida Keys who have never seen anything like they are looking at right now. For those who have the means, be generous with your time and treasure to help all those who need help, especially those who have the highest level of need. As is always true, while these kinds of disasters don't spare anyone, if you are a person without means, the impact is much greater. Even as this is happening, we have to try to get back to our BI (before Irma) lives. We had some delays to the start of our church year, but we are finally moving forward. This year the kids are going to be doing some special projects during their Sunday morning RE and we are going to be needing adult help to make them all happen. Our first task is our "7 Principles Playground Bench". We have the bench; we need to sand it a bit, paint the slats with rainbow colors, and then paint the slats with the kids' 7 Principles. It will be a great addition to the playground, especially as the weather begins to cool; the kids can spend time there after church and parents can sit and enjoy the day. We need two adults who can give up a few weeks of Sunday services and come back and supervise the kids in this effort. We will be doing a special Sunday service called "The Council of All Beings" in November, which you will be hearing more about from Rev. Susan, but I need two adults who will come back and work with the kids while they choose their "totems" and then help them construct a costume, hat, etc. to represent it for the service. Finally, we are doing a pageant (yay, who doesn't love kids forgetting their lines while wearing unrecognizable costumes?) to celebrate the Winter Solstice. We are calling all UUCFL thespians and those who would just like to participate in any way that they can. We will need at least two adults who will come back on Sunday and work with the kids on their scripts, costumes, sets, and all that goes into such an endeavor. If any of these particular projects appeals to you, please track me down and let me know. Keep in mind, I will be tracking some of you down even if you don't volunteer!!! Let's head into our upcoming holiday season with hopes for a loving and peace-filled time and let's use all of our talents to make it so. Love and blessings,





Sunday, October 1 – "The Ties That Bind" by the Rev. Susan M. Smith. In the month of October, we will study our 5th UU Principle: "The right of conscience and the use of the democratic process in our congregations and in society at large." Drawing from the wisdom of the Jewish High Holy Days, we will participate in our own rituals of turning and reconciliation to begin the church year with a clear conscience.

Sunday, October 8, Indigenous Persons Day – "We Interrupt This Service" by the Rev. Susan M. Smith. For the second time, Black Lives of UU have asked congregations to participate in a Teach-In to combat White Supremacy. This time we will examine the American Original Sin and ongoing practice of Native American genocide. Lunch will be served.

Sunday, October 15 – "Martin Luther Nailed What Where?" by the Rev. Susan M. Smith. By tradition, on October 31, 1517 German monk Martin Luther nailed on the door of All Saints Church in Wittenberg his 95 theses calling for the Reformation of the Christian church. From this act, Protestant Christianity, which was the identity of our Unitarian and Universalist ancestors, was born. We'll participate in the worldwide commemoration of this event. If you nailed a manifesto about our faith to the church door today, what would you have to say?

Sunday, October 22 -- "The Reformation in Song" by the Rev. Susan M. Smith. Continuing with the 500th Anniversary commemoration of Martin Luther's heretical act, we'll have a service devoted to Martin Luther as a master hymnodist. Choir will sing. We will have an Ingathering of New Members ceremony. Lunch will be served.

Sunday, October 29 – "Communing with The Ancestors". Whether it is Samhain/All Hallows Eve on October 31, All Saints Day on November 1, All Souls Day on November 2, or Día de Meurtos which spans all three days, the end of October is acknowledged throughout the Western world as a time to remember our ancestors. Bring a photo of your own dearly departed for the altar. A pumpkin carving will follow the service.
