

### Religious Education






We are about to embark on another church year. I am very happy that this summer we have had several visits from families with children. Most of those families have been very pleased with our environment, positive about our children's religious education program and happy with UUCFL in general. As I know from experience though, once school starts, it is harder for these folks to make their way to church. I think we have to come up with some ideas to try and encourage them to make their way to church once in a while, stay connected on a regular basis, and participate from time to time in our church wide activities.

One way that we can do this is to make sure that we have people at the greeter's stand every Sunday, so that we get their information. I don't have people fill out forms the first time I see them, as it tends to make them uncomfortable, but, when we tell them at the greeter's stand that the form they fill out gets them our newsletter, that usually does not scare them. I also think that having someone at the entrance helps folks feel more comfortable, and from a selfish point of view, it helps me if there is a greeter, and they can let me know that someone has come in with children. We have to have more volunteer involvement at UUCFL at many levels, some that come with a fair amount of responsibility. Greeting is a one off, you can come and do it, and there is no report to write, no meeting to attend, and all you have to do is show up a little early for church. We are always talking about growing our membership, and one of the ways to start is to make sure that every person, every child, every family that walks through our door feels welcome and has an idea of what to do at our service. So, I am going to be looking for greeters, and I hope that when I ask, you are all going to say YES!!!!

## Labyrinth Café Concerts Presents Passerine Saturday September 13 at 7:30pm

Passerine's (Carmela Pedicini, David Brain, Sara Stovall Moone) distinctive sound combines vocal harmonies, the crisp rhythms of an acoustic guitar and the haunting voices of the fiddle and dobro (resonator slide guitar). With this unusual arrangement of voices and instruments, Passerine offers a fresh take on traditional folk and bluegrass music as well as a repertoire of original songs that range from sweet ballads to the edgier side of contemporary Americana. #### Free Film, Priceless Discussion about Drones

You've heard about drones. You know what they do. You know that we use them to fight terrorism and protect American soldiers from the risks they would face on the ground. Yet the Obama administration, when deciding to employ drones, may not have considered those most affected: innocent civilians. In Pakistan, Yemen, and Somalia, drones have become an integral part of civilians' lives. Even those who have not lost a loved one cannot ignore the noise and the damage drones caused.



Since the U.S. started using drones in 2004, hundreds of civilians have been killed in Pakistan alone.200 of them are believed to be children. The United States government is a world leader in the use of drones and OUR tax dollars are financing them. Like most technologies, drones are not intrinsically good or evil. It depends on how they are used. We citizens need to educate ourselves about this new technology.

On Sunday, September 28, 1 p.m. at the church you can see the documentary film, The Wounds of Waziristan which depicts several first-hand accounts about the US's use of armed drones in the Pakistan tribal areas. This will help you understand what life is like for ordinary people living under the constant threat of drone strikes.

The presentation is sponsored by War vs Human Needs, South Florida, an affiliate of Peace Action and the UUCFL Social Justice Committee. Ed Wujciak of Hollywood is the discussion leader. After the film he will lead an open discussion about how drones are currently being used and how they may be used in the future. Are drones legal? Are they effective? Are there unresolved privacy or civil liberties issues? What else should we be thinking about? Please bring your questions and concerns and join us.




#### **Announcing the 2014-2015 UUA Common Read**

#### **Interfaith Leaders Urge President to Act on Immigration**

In a letter delivered today to President Barack Obama, religious leaders urge the president to take administrative action on the issue of immigration reform.

This letter comes to the president as he continues to weigh executive action in the midst of Congress' inability to pass comprehensive immigration reform.

In the letter to President Obama, the Rev. Peter Morales, president of the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA), and five other national faith leaders call for executive action that includes three significant components:



- 1. Stop deportations immediately.
- 2. Expand deferred action to immigrant workers and families.
- 3. Protect unaccompanied children who have sought refuge within the United States border.

Morales was joined on the letter by Rev. Geoffrey A. Black, General Minister and President of United Church of Christ, Bishop Minerva G. Carcaño of the United Methodist Church, Los Angeles Area, Rev. Dr. Susan T. Henry-Crowe, General Secretary, Board of Church and Society of the United Methodist Church, Rev. John L. McCullough, President and CEO of Church World Service, and Rev. Dr. Sharon Watkins, General Minister and President of Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).

The letter reads in part, "As a nation of immigrants, we must stand on the side of love with immigrant families. As a religious community, we cannot ignore the moral call to help those who are suffering. And as citizens of the world, we must respect the inherent worth and dignity of all."

September 7 - Born Again Unitarian Universalism or What Do You Say After You Say I Am a UU- Rev. Gail will explore some new and fun ways to talk about and share our exciting faith with friends, family and co-workers and even each other. We need to deepen our conversations about our world views and maybe this will be a starting point. The idea of how to develop, grow and sustain a strong Unitarian Universalist identity will be the primary theme of the 2014-15 church program year. Come to the service and join us on 4 Tuesday nights for the follow up interactive class sessions.

September 14 - Water Sunday and a Look Toward Our Future - On this homecoming Sunday we bring our symbolic water to share our summer journeys and learnings. Rev. Gail and Prez Gary will officiate. The Rev. Dr. Randy Becker our Long Range Planning consultant will offer the message for the day. We will have a celebration lunch and then we invite all our members and friends to participate in discussing options for our future.

September 21 - Compassion As Key to a More Conflict Free World - We seem to be at war around the world and in our own country. Sometimes we are at war with our communities, family and sometimes in our own heads. Rev. Gail will look at some steps we can take to living a more compassionate life that will help us understand all levels of conflict.

**September 28 - Living in an Awe Filled Universe** - We sometimes live in awe of an amazing world and we sometimes complain about what an awful world we live in. Sometimes understanding what it means to live in the balance between these extremes is hard. Rev. Gail will look to lessons of the Jewish High Holy days for lessons on how to do this.

October 5 - Memoir As Spiritual Tool/ Telling My Story and Other's Stories to Help You Tell Your Story - Rev. Gail's sabbatical did not allow her to take a planned workshop on Memoir but she did spend a lot of time reading some very unique memoirs and personal histories- non-fictional and fictional alike. Today with some congregational readers she will share some classic memoirs and offer a unique tool for using our own life stories as a tool for emotional and spiritual growth. A short workshop on ways to tell your own story will be offered after church for all interested. It will be free.
