

President's Message



My thoughts this month are taken directly from Marlene Geary's article, "Free and Responsible".

Have you ever found yourself saying "Being a Unitarian Universalist means that you can believe anything you want?" The Rev. Liz Strong writes: "Unitarian Universalism is not the freedom to believe anything or nothing. It is the freedom to reason and feel your own way to what the evidence leads you to believe. You have the freedom to form your own beliefs. [But] there are responsibilities that go with this freedom." The Rev. Tim Kutzmark takes it from there: "Just because Unitarian Universalism doesn't have a rigid structure doesn't mean there is no structure at all. Just because Unitarian Universalism doesn't have a rigid

set of beliefs doesn't mean there are no beliefs at all. Just because Unitarian Universalism has an open embrace doesn't mean that any belief is welcome here. Just because Unitarian Universalism affirms us as individuals doesn't mean that our own mind is the be all and end all of religious discernment."

Our faith is rooted in radical beliefs, revolutionary concepts about divinity and humanity and the nature of life that reach back several thousand years. Timeless truths taught by our Unitarian and Universalist forebears are at the core of our faith. These core beliefs are anchored in this present day and age by what we call our Seven Principles and Purposes.

The Principles are the heart of our faith. We are called not just to affirm these, which is easy. We are called to actively promote them in our home, our workplace, our neighborhood, our town, our state, our country, and our world. And if our own beliefs are not in sympathy with any of these seven—then this Unitarian Universalist faith is not a place for us. I can't be here, you can't be here, we can't be here, and simply believe whatever we want. Our own search for truth and meaning must be guided by these seven religious principles.

My mom used to say: "There ain't no such thing as a free lunch." Well, I'd echo that and say: "There ain't no such thing as a free search."

Rev. Susan's Space

By the time you read this, we will already be in the midst of exploring the four shared values upon which we will build our new UUCFL vision and longrange plan. We selected them through small group process earlier this year. To remind you, they are: Compassion; Connectedness; Conscious Choice; and Transcendence. Through Sunday services, Children's Religious Education, and values "art" in the sanctuary and social media, we are trying to determine what these high ideals mean for us as a people doing ministry and seeking justice in this particular community at this particular time in history.

In my work with congregations, I've seen dozens of these long-range plans. They tend to focus on physical plant, staffing, structural tweaks and big talk about numerical growth and money. However, I believe strongly in the insights that Loren Mead expressed in his book More Than Numbers: The Ways Churches Grow. Rev. Mead tells us that buildings, staff, governance, committee structure, etc. must be in service to larger, more meaningful goals while numerical and financial growth are the result of success with our foundational goal.

He calls these goals "maturational" and "incarnational." Maturational goals are those that help us become better UU's tomorrow than we are today as individuals, as families, as small groups and as a congregation. Usually, when I ask about what these goals might be, I'm told that UU's want to be able to talk about Unitarian Universalism in a clear and persuasive way, know something of our history, contribute more to the ministries of the church, be more tolerant and accepting of others, have a spiritual discipline that brings them inner peace, and be more active in social justice work. Incarnational goals advance our values in the larger world by asking whether others know our values and whether we are making a difference. For example, as a Welcoming Congregation that has committed ourselves to work for justice for gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender rights, we would expect to have goals for progress that we wish to see in this area in our community and partnerships that serve those goals.

PLEASE SAVE THE DATE OF MAY 20!! We will gather together from 9am to noon to cast a vision for our future shaped by what we are learning about our shared values and including both maturational and incarnation goals. The work that we do this day will be worked into a plan over the summer. There will be both childcare and opportunities for children and youth to participate.

The big question we will ask ourselves is, "What would you like Unitarian Universalism to be in South Florida fifty years from today?" I've found that this legacy-level question avoids engaging the personal preferences and agendas that limit the scope of our visioning.

We will dream a big dream together in the spirit of our ancestor Henry David Thoreau who wrote, "If you have built castles in the air, your work need not be lost; that is where they should be. Now put the foundations under them."

Building and Grounds

Let there be light! You may notice at night that our parking lot lights are back to full strength. We had been researching an upgrade to LEDs, but we have found that we should go at least one more round with the lights we have as we gather more information. Our new video monitors installed on the pulpit have proved very popular. These will provide new multi-media possibilities to church services and other activities. The new Peace Pole is here and will be installed on the entry loop outside to be one of the first things people see as they enter the church. Our Janine Griffiths will be helping to design the area which will become a beautiful reflection point on the grounds. A formal dedication ceremony will take place. We are also preparing for new front doors and other internal door replacements. Our cabinets that used to live in the sanctuary will be recycled and fitted into each restroom providing some much needed storage, and we are currently installing paper and soap dispensers to make the facilities more accessible. A few outdoor improvements are coming around the backyard and playground. We look forward to all of the improvements coming our way and we are sure you will too.

Labyrinth Café Concerts Presents Catie Curtis Saturday April 8 at 7:30pm



Catie Curtis is a veteran on the singer/songwriter folk scene, crisscrossing the US for 20 years – and counting – performing shows, recording and releasing 13 CDs, with devoted fans following her every move. She's performed at the White House several times, at two Presidential Inaugural Balls, with Lilith Fair, and at Carnegie Hall. The winner of more than her share of Boston Music Awards, she also took the Grand Prize in the 2006 International Songwriting Competition (out of 15,000 entries). Catie recorded a duet with Kris Kristofferson for his CD "The Austin Sessions" and there's a good chance you've heard a song of hers in a movie or on a TV show. The New Yorker called Catie a "folk-rock goddess."



When Maine-native Catie Curtis is not writing, recording, touring or producing concerts, she also officiates and performs at fans' weddings (having received her ordination online in 2011), teaches at song schools around the country, leads high school songwriting workshops, speaks on diversity, and runs a songwriter retreat in Maine every summer called "Catie at the Cove." "My goal is not just to reflect my own personal life, but to reflect back to people what happens in life, in their lives, in our world," she says. "As we all know, sh#t happens." Wise words from a truly intrepid songwriter.


