



President's Message

"I know there are days when we want to be liked by others a little more than we want to change the world. But, if we decided to speak up a little more and hesitate a little less, we will begin making ripples of change." — Sharad Vivek Sagar



Our long-range planning process determined that there was a majority who would like to see our community continue far into the future and that people were invested, at least intellectually and emotionally, in that process. We at UUCFL have made tremendous progress in the last year and a half in advancing toward our goals that we determined we wanted in the long-term plan. We still have a long journey ahead of us, and we need everyone's attention and assistance. Our pledges have come up, and we have a better attendance on most Sundays. We have made improvements to our physical facility such as new chairs, new front doors, and new floors; and we are making other improvements and have projects in the planning stage. The Hollywood Fellowship has joined us and become an integral part of our church life. We have grown in some ways.

There are other places we are still sorely lacking. We need to continue to deal with physical plant infrastructure issues, but more importantly we need to deal with our human infrastructure or organizational issues. We still come up as sorely lacking in coming across as a unique community where people want to come and join and stay once they are here. The second place we are lacking is in our volunteerism. As they say in recovery, too many of us talk the talk but do not walk the walk. We experience a lack of involvement by many folks. Most of the time the same people show up and are involved in many tasks and activities. By the time this is in your hands, we will have had our first All-Team Night where different social justice issues can be address by us gathering and working together.

I am asking for your input to see what others have to say on this issue. I want to know if you would like more social experiences or maybe you have an unexpressed passion for one of the committees or organizations we have that are ongoing. We are gathering once a month for All-Committee night, where the Board meets with the various committees and works out plans and determines projects to work on to move ahead with that committee. Unfortunately, sometimes there are more Board members than committee members. We have gotten involved with the committees, but we cannot do the work of the committees alone. We need people to show up and bring fresh ideas and be ready to assist and turn our recent successes and small progress into long-term success and continuing progress. We need to keep up the momentum. Members are also asked to attend our Annual Budget Meeting on Sunday February 25 after service to vote together on the plan for 2018. Be a part of the solution and of making our unique and diverse community an option for future generations so that people who are forward thinking, progressive, accepting, curious, and concerned have a place to come and be enriched by whatever journey they choose because they are accepted and nurtured. Exist in peace and give kindness a face.

Rev. Susan's Space

From one of my favorite "sacred" texts,
The Unofficial Guide to Walt Disney World,
the section entitled "Reality Testing: Whose Dream Is It?":
Remember when you were little and you got that nifty
remote control car for Christmas, the one Dad wouldn't let
you play with? Did you wonder who the car was really for?
Ask yourself a similar question about your vacation to Walt
Disney World. Whose dream are you trying to make come
true: yours or your child's?... So, is your happy fantasy of
introducing your child to Disney magic a pipe dream?
Not necessarily, but you have to be open to reality testing.



As a developmental minister, I have often thought of these wise words and tried to regularly employ the reality test in my own work. Not that I thought of the leaders of congregations as children. In fact, it was their very autonomy and agency that caused this full stop for reality testing. I have learned over the years that a congregation can vote to do something, yearn to do something, hold a fear of not doing something, and then not do it. I've had to ask myself whether the goal that the congregation is describing is really what they want or what they think they should want.

I came here 18 months ago for a 2-year contract because this congregation feared for its future. The simple goal was to survive. The stated vision was to thrive. As I prepare to renew my contract, we are at one of those "be-careful-what-you-ask-for" moments of decision. I am attempting to discern with your Board, your Committee on Ministry, past leaders, random sources, and no small amount of prayer what you are willing to do for what you say you want – because what you are willing to do IS what you truly want.

What do I mean when I say what you do IS what you want? I say that I want to lose the weight I gained when my thyroid acted up this Fall. What I do is eat comfort food and shorten the dog's walks. What do I really want? I have to assume that what I really want is to eat comfort food and shorten the dog's walks. The me that observes this asks whether it is ethical or even worthwhile to try to make me want something else. When we look at volunteering and giving and attendance and participation at UUCFL, what does it indicate about our real goals?

Two months ago the Committee on Ministry posted a two-page document to a link on the home page of our uucfl.org website. We held a couple of lightly attended listening sessions. We received a bit of email feedback. As we work to craft this vision into concrete goals, I ask myself over and over whether UUCFL really wants what it says it wants. I hope that you will seriously and reverently consider this question with me.






Memorial for Tom Karneth

The Social Justice Committee discussed the upcoming Social Justice Committees meeting on January 24.

congregation focused on the upcoming Bold Justice Nehemiah Action so that they can ask friends and family to attend. We also would like to make sure that no church activities are scheduled that evening which will draw people away from attending. We talked about possibly getting a bus to transport people, and whether we need to have food, and if so, what. It was mentioned that Rev. Harris in Boca gets a full bus by baking her delicious brownies.

The focuses of Bold Justice this year are again elder abuse and civil citation. They are trying to get a statewide civil citation thing happening, and it is being made difficult by the fact that the state sheriff's group is controlled by folks who don't really believe in it, and the legislature looks to that group's approval for moving this sort of legislation.
