President's Message The Year and Years Ahead



It was very heartwarming seeing so many of our members attend the Sunday Service with Rev. Randy Becker on the need for our Church to move ahead with a strategic plan as a means to sustain our vibrancy, membership, relevance and to attract new members. The afternoon meeting run by Rev. Becker which had over sixty in attendance clearly showed the strong interest of virtually everyone that we did need to move ahead in developing a professionally prepared strategic plan to be implemented beginning in early 2015.

If you were not able to be present at Church that day, it was agreed that three meetings would be scheduled for Long Range Planning Phase 2. Each congregant is requested to attend <u>one</u> meeting to respond in person to a set of questions about the direction of our Church that you would like to see us take in preparing the strategic plan. At each of the meetings, members attending will be divided up into small groups and asked to respond (verbally) to a series of questions prepared by Rev. Becker who has gained extensive experience working with UU

congregations in developing strategic plans. Additionally, Rev. Becker is requesting that attendees at these meetings as well as congregants not able to attend one of the three meetings respond by completing a form, either in a written format (forms distributed at the meetings and also available on Sundays at church) or on "Survey Monkey" at https://www.surveymonkey.com/s/UUCFL. The information gained by both the in person responses as well as survey responses will better help us in making proposed changes.

We have already completed the first meeting in late September, but you still have 2 opportunities upcoming. The next meeting is scheduled to take place on Sunday, October 19 at 12:45 *after* the morning service and ending at 2:45. The last meeting is scheduled to take place on Monday, October 27 starting at 7 PM and ending at 9:00 PM. At each of the meetings, members will be divided into groups of 6-12 people. Each group will have a note taker and a team leader to pose various questions and to keep strict time lines to avoid a situation where only a few individuals do most of the talking in each small group.

Whether you are a current member, past member or just a friend, if you are interested in making our Church a place we want to attend regularly and to have an important place in each of our lives, please attend one of the three scheduled meetings.

Party Time at UUCFL Saturday October 4 at 7:00pm - And You Are Invited!





Red House recording artist **Cliff Eberhardt** knew by age seven that he was going to be a singer and songwriter. As a child Cliff taught himself to play guitar, piano, bass and drums. In his teens Eberhardt was fortunate enough to live close to the Main Point (one of the best folk clubs on the East Coast), he cut his teeth listening to the likes of James Taylor, Joni Mitchell, Bruce Springsteen, Howlin' Wolf, Muddy Waters, Bonnie Raitt, and Mississippi John Hurt - receiving an early and impressive tutorial in acoustic music. At the same time, he was also listening to great pop songwriters like Cole Porter, the Gershwins, and Rodgers and Hart, which explain his penchant for great melodies and clever lyrical twists. A driving force of the Greenwich Village New Folk movement and well known among his peers, Cliff's songs have been covered by the likes of Richie Havens, Buffy St. Marie, Erasure, Lucy Kaplansky and the folk superstar band "Cry, Cry, Cry" (Dar Williams, Richard Shindell, Lucy Kaplansky).

October 5 - Memoir As Spiritual Tool/ Telling My Story and Other's Stories to Help You Tell Your Story - Rev. Gail's sabbatical did not allow her to take a planned workshop on Memoir but she did spend a lot of time reading some very unique memoirs and personal histories- non-fictional and fictional alike. Today with some congregational readers she will share some classic memoirs and offer a unique tool for using our own life stories as a tool for emotional and spiritual growth. A short workshop on ways to tell your own story will be offered after church for all interested. It will be free.

October 12 - Are you a Furnace Church or a Foot Warmer

Church? - Another encore sermon from Rev. Carole Yorke. Today the stewardship canvass to fund the needs of this congregation for the coming year begins. If you questioned it before, do not divorce yourself from the truth that the funding of this church's future demands your most responsible and generous support. It is our shared responsibility to help make this church all that it can

become. In such an effort, it is important, even vital, that we all participate in the decision-making process before us. This is an opportunity to share our individual reflections on what is going well and what our hopes and dreams for the future of our shared religious community are. And, at the onset of this 2014-2015 canvass effort, it is only fair that I share with you both the good news and the bad news.

The good news is . . . that we already have the money to do everything that needs to be accomplished as well as the funding to do all that this congregation wants to do in the coming 2014-2015 church program year.

The bad news is that . . . it is still out there in your pockets and checkbooks.

October 19 - Cycles of Jewish Life - Rabbi Noah Kitty from Congregation Etz Chaim will speak to us about the Cycles of Jewish Life and the Importance of the Sabbath for everyone.
