I just heard that Maya Angelou died. This is a very sad day for all of us. The loss of this grand lady of American letters may seem just another death of an old important person who was not doing well for quite a while, and while they had been a person of note, we did not really see or hear from them very much anymore. All of that may be true on the face, but in reality, the loss is very real and very visceral. When I hear a recording of her reading her own work now, I will think first of how she is gone, and then allow myself the experience of listening to that magnificent voice, reading her amazing thoughts. Just listening to her being interviewed on any number of topics by any number of interviewers had always been a joy-she never minces words, her love of life and people was always there, and we will miss those opportunities to hear her on

some topic or happening of the day. Ms. Angelou had quite a life story-ugly, and full of pain at the beginning, and triumphant at the end. All of it she turned into art. Her poetry is packed with colorful and pointed language which paints clear pictures of her life and feelings-her prose writing is so lyrical that sometimes I have to tell myself that it is prose and not a poem. Finally, and maybe most importantly for some of us, she wrote of what it is like to be a woman, and especially a black woman. I cannot know what it is to be a black woman, but her work about being a woman has always struck me deeply, so I can only imagine that for black woman, the strike has been even deeper. I hope that you will all go to your bookshelf, or to the library and grab one of her books and spend some time with it; then go online and pull up one of the many recordings of her reading and take a listen, and thank our collective lucky stars for having had the gift of the brilliant Dr. Maya Angelou.

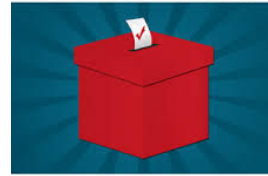

UUCFL Unanimously Ratifies Congregational Resolution on Move to Amend

Unitarian Universalist Church of Fort Lauderdale, Florida

MOVE TO AMEND RESOLUTION

Because Unitarian Universalists believe in the "inherent worth and dignity of every person," and in the "use of the democratic process" in society at large, and:

1. Whereas, free and fair elections are essential to democracy and effective self-governance; and,
2. Whereas, We the People adopted and ratified the United States Constitution to protect free speech and other rights of people, not corporations; and,
3. Whereas unlimited spending by corporations, flooding the political marketplace, drowning out the voices of individuals, jeopardizes the very democracy that we hold dear; and,
4. Whereas, corporations are clearly not people but instead are entities created by the law of states and nations; and,
5. Whereas, corporations are not mentioned in the Constitution, and the people have never granted constitutional rights to corporations, and
6. Whereas, corporations are not and have never been human beings, and therefore are rightfully subservient to human beings and governments as our legal creations;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Unitarian Universalist Church of Fort Lauderdale, Florida stands with the Move to Amend campaign and faith communities across the country to defend democracy from the corrupting effects of undue corporate power by amending the United States Constitution to establish that:

Section 1. The U.S. Constitution protects only the rights of natural human beings, not corporations.

Section 2. Money is not speech, and therefore regulating political contributions and spending is not equivalent to limiting political speech.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the members of Unitarian Universalist Church of Fort Lauderdale, Florida hereby instruct our local, state and federal representatives to enact resolutions and legislation to advance this effort.

Approved as a resolution of the full Congregation at its Congregational Meeting May 25, 2014.

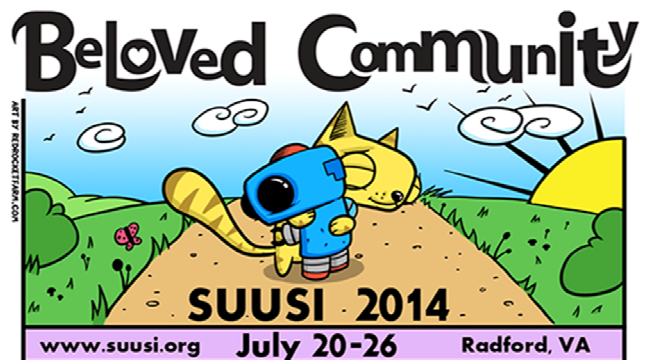
Then come to SUUSI! July 20-26, 2014 in Radford, Virginia.

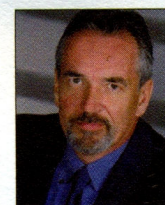
