


Summer Fun Activities

UUA President Issues Statement on Contraceptive Mandate Decision by SCOTUS

June 30, 2014

The Rev. Peter Morales, president of the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA), issued this statement following the U.S. Supreme Court's decision on the contraceptive mandate:

"Today in its 5 to 4 decision in *Burwell v. Hobby Lobby*, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled that 'closelyheld' companies cannot be required to pay for



insurance coverage for contraceptives because it violates a federal law protecting religious freedom. This is yet another blow against reproductive rights. Removing the no-cost contraceptive coverage requirement in the Affordable Care Act dangerously diminishes the religious, moral, and legal rights of every American, but especially women.

I am deeply concerned by the growing rights granted to corporations by this decision and others of this Court and our Congress. I am also deeply concerned by the growing use of the religious freedom argument as a tool of discrimination and oppression.

The Unitarian Universalist Association, in its dedication to the principle of separation of church and state, joined with other faith groups in an amicus curiae brief that argued the federal contraceptive rule does not substantially burden religious exercise under the Religious Freedom Restoration Act and applauded the Affordable Care Act as the single most important piece of legislation to address gender- and race-based health inequities.

Unitarian Universalists affirm that parenthood and sexuality are sacred gifts. Women's access to key preventative contraceptive services is essential not only to their health, but also to other rights including religious liberty, equality, and economic security.

Though I am exceedingly disappointed in this ruling, I reaffirm the commitment of the UUA to work for reproductive justice in accordance with our first principle because 'justice is what love looks like in public.'"

August 3 - Pulpit Guest Rev. Lori Cardona - Rev. Lori Cardona of Love Miracles Community Ministries gives an encore presentation with "Forgiving is Forever" helping us to understand how we are being confronted by obstacles and circumstances that challenge our willingness to forgive.

August 10- Welcoming Obstacles - Rev. Gail returns to the pulpit after a very different sabbatical Part II than she had in mind. However, life rarely turns out just as planned. Rev. Gail will discuss the idea of making the obstacles in our journey part of our spiritual practices and how the lessons we don't sign up to learn are often the ones we need the most.

August 17 - Eternal Wisdom for Changing Times -

It has been said that there is nothing new under the sun but there are always new situations in which we need to apply old ideas. Rev. Gail will look at many sources ancient and modern to help us think about the difference between information and knowledge and real wisdom.



August 24 - Practical Shamanism - Rev. Gail 's interest in Shamanism has been one of the most enduring aspects of her study of religion in general. From the theoretical and scholarly study of historical shamanism to studying periodically with various modern teachers of the practice, she will try to show why this phenomena should be of interest to even the most secular or skeptical among us.

August 31 - Building A World With Economic Justice For All- On this Labor Day Rev. Gail shares this year's theme for the South Florida Interfaith Worker Justice on whose board she has served for many years. We have determined to focus this year on a more positive model for the future of all people in the work force and not just look all the time at what is wrong. How can we build an economic system what works for more of us and what practical small things can we all do in the meantime.

September 7 - Born Again Unitarian Universalism or What Do You Say After You Say I Am a UU - Drawing on several long time favorite sources Rev. Gail will help look at new ways to think about our faith, to talk about our faith, to grow our faith and to enjoy being part of one of the most unique communities on earth. The idea of how to develop, grow and sustain a strong Unitarian Universalist identity will be the primary theme of the 2014-15 church program year. Come to the service and join us on 4 Tuesday nights for the follow up interactive class sessions.
