

UUA President Applauds Statement on Same Sex Marriage by President Obama

May 9, 2012

The following statement was issued by Unitarian Universalist Association President Rev. Peter Morales:

President Obama's announcement today that he supports the right of same sex couples to marry is a courageous step forward in the direction of justice and equality for all Americans. I applaud the President's decision to declare his support for the freedom to marry for all loving couples. Like many Americans, President Obama says his position on this issue has evolved over the years, and today it seems clear that the arc of the universe is bending toward justice.



The Unitarian Universalist Association called for the freedom to marry for same-sex couples in 1996. Unitarian Universalists will continue to stand on the side of love for marriage equality until the freedom to marry belongs to all.

Transitions and Reframing

I talk a good game about how we all need to embrace change and remain flexible in all aspects of our lives but in reality, I dislike change as much as anyone. Often I will stay in a bad situation way too long because change just feels too scary. When I think about which changes in my life I deliberately chose and which ones were thrust upon me I am convinced that either way it always took me quite a while to actually adjust to a major change.

I have lived alone for much of my adult life. I have also spent time living with a romantic interest, a roommate or with several other people. Whenever, I switch from one lifestyle to another it always feels like a huge adjustment. As most of you know for much of the last year and a half, I have lived with a young man (David -- who I think of as my adopted son) and a dog (Whisper). In the last couple of months David relocated to work and look into school possibilities out West. I found a foster home for Whisper where he can get more attention that I can give him. I feel that both these developments are for the best in the long run. However, while I enjoy having my house more orderly and more freedom of movement, I also feel a deep sense of loss. I am sure that David and I will visit, take a trip together or meet at holidays in the future, but it is unlikely that we will live together in quite this way again. It feels deeply sad to me. I never wanted to have children but while sharing my home with David, I learned that I had a nurturing and motherly side that I had no idea existed. Negotiating the ups and downs of a family of choice was stressful at times but it was also great to have someone to process the day with, to share comments about the day's news, and to chat with about what we were reading or thinking about.

Now I am back to having to plan my own schedule again and call friends if I want to share thoughts or discuss a problem. I am a very extraverted person but I am also someone who can entertain myself. I love to read, watch movies, listen to music and write as well as all the solitary aspects of what I do as a minister. However, I miss having a more normal work life with colleagues to chat with everyday.

Everything in life is a trade off and we never know what any decision will bring us. I loved being a late life mom. Of course David and I will stay in close touch but this has been a unique time in my life. I don't know yet what the next phase of my life will be but I am sure it will reveal itself and be another adventure. I plan lots of travel, more college teaching at Strayer and maybe other settings. I plan to continue doing ministry for many years into the future and I hope to do more writing. I come from a long lived family, so I am hoping I will be around for a long time and have many more adventures but change is in the air for me right now and part of me is not embracing it yet. I will be doing my traveling in June this year and back for July and August where I will be teaching World Religions again for Strayer, doing some summer services and offering more sessions of the Soul to Soul class. I hope that perhaps the often slightly smaller church services that are normal in summer will allow me more time to interact with more of you and perhaps get to know you a little better. Changes will continue to come to each of our lives and to the church. Our challenge is always to find ways to respond that both honors what we have just experienced and open ourselves for the next stage of life. May your changes all lead you to new and richer horizons.

A Call for Social Justice

There are conceivably hundreds of causes vying for your attention. There's the animal shelter down the road and Sarah McLachlan pleading with sad-eyed puppies on your television screen, there are people waving signs on the news, there are friends posting petitions and inviting you to rallies via FaceBook, there are strangers handing you fliers and asking for donations and there are people at your church who make announcements. All of them want just a few minutes (or hours) of your time or a few dollars from your wallet.

It can be exhausting. You want to volunteer at the shelter or give money to the children in Darfur or spend an afternoon trying to get people to sign a petition down at the mall. You want to do a lot of things but you just don't have the time.

At some point, you have to look someone in the eye and say "no". Which is difficult but also, certainly, necessary. That brings you to a dilemma of whom to give your time and money to. On a personal level that comes down to a matter of morals and beliefs - which causes speak to you most personally.

As a church we face similar issues. We have a beautiful, diverse congregation full of passionate people. Every single one of us has a cause, or several, that we want people to give attention to.

As a church we also have the dilemma of deciding where to direct our efforts. This is often going to come down to where we will make the most impact. Which causes will we, as a community, be able to do the most good for? Where are we needed as a group of individuals?

This, too, comes down to our morals and beliefs but also requires of us a certain level of ruthlessness. We have to be honest with ourselves about what we're able to do as a small congregation. We have to accept and embrace our unique set of circumstances.

Justice is like an arrow - without proper direction and adequate force it will never reach its mark. We must become skilled archers. We must pull the bow taut and keep our aim straight and true.

I have faith that our beloved community is up for this task.



One of the failures of anti-racism/anti-oppression/multiculturalism programs in this country has been the way many of them engendered massive amounts of guilt in the participants. In contrast, Building the World We Dream About created a safe space place to reflect and share experiences and feelings. Boy did we laugh a lot. The value of humor should never be overlooked.

Having said all that, there are two things you definitely should not miss. The first is the BtWWDA Improv Players in the June 17th Sunday Service: SAVE THE DATE! It occurs to me that there's a worst case scenario in which the skit could still be amusing to everyone else. We might blow the whole thing sort of like unintentional Keystone Kops. Hopefully, we'll provide an inspirational, thought provoking, moving service.

Following the service we'll be showing the Tim Wise appearance/talk from the 2011 GA one more time. Rev Gail called him Jon Stewart on steroids. We used this entertaining but informative presentation in lieu of one of the BtWWDA Workshops. Rev. Gail and the entire Dream Team enthusiastically recommend that the whole congregation see it. 

This courageous book deserves to spark a national debate about the purposes of war."

This is the time of year most of our congregations shift their leadership focus to the next program year. New officers are installed. Planning retreats are held.

It is also a good time to do a thorough review of your ministries. How goes it? What's happened with worship and educational attendance this year? How does this year's membership data (demographics as well as numbers) compare with the previous 5 years? Where are we on our 3-5 year plan (oh, you say, "what plan?" – time to get one going!). What are we doing really well and how we can we do more of that? What's the buzz? How is our morale?

And, perhaps the most important question: Are we more mature in our understanding of religious conviction and more successful living our values in daily life? And: how do you measure that?

Assessing ministry is a subtle and difficult task, so it is often avoided. However, you cannot plan for where you are going without first knowing where you are. And if you are unclear of your purpose (remember all the admonitions to craft a short statement of purpose or mission?), how will you know what matters most as you move ahead?

Review and update your Mission statement!

The District can provide leadership with assessment and planning tools. Do ask if you'd like some assistance. Meanwhile, here's a quick checklist for your leadership retreat:

- What are we doing well and can improve further?
- Are there pinch-points in our work that can be quickly fixed and put off the agenda?
- On a "doing well" vs. "needs work" basis, how would you rate your:

- o Community worship.
- o Adult education, faith development.
- o Children's faith instruction/development.
- o Member to Member caring & support.
- o Congregational involvement in the larger community.
- o Leadership development.
- o Transparency and integrity regarding stewardship & finances.

Good luck, plan well, be well. I hope you have made your plans for Justice GA . I'll see some of you in Phoenix.


