

Rev. Susan's Space

First, I want to thank those of you who gave your time to participate in the Visioning Event in May. We had some very inspirational conversations and came up with some ambitious and impactful ideas that the Committee on Ministry will process and present back to you as a draft vision. After we're sure we have the vision right, we'll move on to developing a plan. Study of best practices will be an important part of this planning. The chairperson of the Committee on Ministry this coming church year will be Annette Vafa, and she is joined there by Larry Wilkner and Grandfather.



At this point, we also need the help of artists (poets, musicians, visual artists, educators) to transform our words into images and other expressions. Given our four values (Compassion, Connectedness, Conscientious Choice and Transcendence), how might we express these in banners, signs, works of arts, t-shirts, memes and bumper stickers? Are there songs, readings, stories and other performing arts pieces that come to mind or are you inspired to create something? Feel free to propose a project in person or post something on our Facebook blog.

"Transcendence" may be the hardest of these four to wrap our mind around. Do we know it when we see it? In July, I'll be leading three experiential services specifically designed to tap into our 1st UU Source, which is direct experience of transcendent mystery and wonder. Our Strange Uncle Ralph Waldo Emerson declared that we should be able to experience "The Holy" as we understand it "without mediator or veil." That can be a scary prospect, but it is a worthwhile goal. If you think of UUism as a cerebral religious path, just consider that our 1st Source is grounded in our direct experience. We'll also have our annual Poetry Sunday in July, which is another manifestation of the experience we seek.

The Transcendent is what calls us out of ourselves into a more robust sense of our connectedness to all things while also calling us deeply into ourselves as yet another manifestation of "all that is holy". It is hinted at in terms like Mystery, Awe and Wonder. Transcendence is not strictly a spiritual or religious thing. Whenever we are inspired, joyful, creative or filled with compassion, we have touched the realm of the transcendent. Arts, service, justice-seeking, quiet, celebration and so many others are well-known and often-traveled paths to the Transcendent. As Lao Tsu wrote in the Tao teh Ching: "There is no need to run outside for better seeing... rather abide at the center of your being; for the more you leave it the less you learn."

Susan Frederick-Gray Elected President of the UUA




Minister of Phoenix, Arizona, congregation wins three-way race to become Unitarian Universalist Association's ninth elected president and the first woman elected to the office.




