

Rev. Susan's Space

We're going to try a big experiment in September, and I need you to trust me. We say every Sunday that Love is our Spirit and Service is our Law. We are not short of love, that is for sure. We identified Compassion and Connectedness as two of our four shared values. We listen with genuine loving kindness to the joys and concerns written in our journal each Sunday and open up our hearts to others represented in our prayers, by our dropped stones and evoked in our sermons and readings. Some of us bring refreshments. Some bring food for the needy. Some give rides and check in on the ill.



Several participate in groups of mutual support. We do not lack for love, but we do lack for volunteers. It has been months since we had a Caring working group and more than a year (maybe two) since we had one for Membership or Social Justice. These, along with Stewardship, Sunday Services and Faith Development, are the vehicles through which the Church serves the world.

Because we lack a volunteer organization in these areas, this Service which is our Law is spotty at best. Those who have the tendency toward expressions of caring extend that care to those who they know and like. This works well in a congregation of 50 where everyone knows everyone else, and these behaviors are key to maintaining a size of no more than 50 – a tribe, an extended family. This is not the size congregation that we are. We do not know everyone. We cannot depend on word of mouth. Moreover, those who toil away in such an incomplete system of Service tend to get burnt out and maybe even resentful while those who want to help have no way of accessing the necessary information and putting their talents to work to make our world a better place. These problems – volunteer burnout and volunteer participation – were identified as major issues in our strategic plan of 2014. It persists today.

So, I've sought the support of our Board of Trustees and our Committee on Ministry to employ an organizational scheme that I've used with other congregations. We will kick it off on Monday, September 11 at 6:30 pm. Absolutely everyone who wishes to be of service to our church and our community and anyone currently serving on a committee is urged to attend then. This does not include representation from small group ministries like UU Sisterhood, Men's Group, CUUPs, Loaves & Fishes, Labyrinth, etc. It does include Sunday Services, Greeters, Finance, Socials, Fundraising, Building and Grounds, Communications, Coffee Hour, Religious Education, various Social Justice projects, etc. Our staff and our board of trustees will be present to enhance our own connection to the ministries of the church. This "All Committee and Board Meeting" will be only 1.5 hours long and will enable us to work more efficiently, involve newcomers more easily, support one another better and obey this Law that is Service.

Please, try to come with an open mind. We know you will bring a loving heart. We promise that your participation will enable us to better be a church of the helping hand.

UUA President: Transgender Ban Is Blatant Discrimination

UUA President the Rev. Susan Frederick-Gray issued the following statement in response to Donald Trump's plan to ban transgender people from serving in the U.S. military:

Yesterday's announcement from President Trump that he is barring transgender individuals from serving in the U.S. military is an act of blatant discrimination against transgender citizens.

As Unitarian Universalists, we denounce President Trump's claim that allowing transgender persons to serve in the United States military would be a burden and a disruption. We believe that transgender people should be accorded all the rights and responsibilities due every citizen, including the right to serve our country in the military. Today, more than 15,000 transgender Americans are on active duty in the military, and their status is now thrown into question.

In reversing the decision made last year by President Obama's administration, President Trump not only undermines the strength and readiness of our armed forces but also goes back on his campaign pledge to support the LGBTQ community. We call upon the Trump administration to uphold the American values of equality and service by reversing yesterday's discriminatory decision.
